Defence policy questions

Is the Ministry of Defence in favour of the worldwide ban on the development or deployment of weapons for manipulating people that the European Parliament called for in resolution **A4-0005/1999** paragraph 27?

Can you see any disadvantages in the UK setting the other nations of the world a good example, by eschewing the development and deployment of these "mind control" weapons unilaterally, even before the worldwide ban requested by the European Parliament had been negotiated and signed by other countries?

Would you be in favour of Britain being at the forefront of any international diplomacy aimed at procuring the worldwide ban called for by the European Parliament?

To what extent would adherence to such a ban, or unilateral eschewing of development or deployment, entail the UK disinvesting in the technologies concerned?

What safeguards are in force that might ensure that commercial pressures upon defence contractors to engage in unethical testing to the detriment of citizens of such technology as they were developing it was resisted?
