CANDIDATE JOHN ALLMAN'S SPEECH, PREPARED IN ADVANCE FOR LOGANLEA MINERS WELFARE HUSTINGS MEETING, 19:00 MONDAY 19 SEPTEMBER 2005

The Alliance For Change isn't an official political party. It is a brand new method for use primarily at general elections, for subverting what a Scottish MI5 defector I know, who is now a gospel preacher, called our "one-party state". We are ruled by an exclusive brotherhood, through a phoney democracy I call the Lib Lab Con Trick. At the last general election, the mass media campaigned relentlessly for several weeks for that brotherhood's three tame parties, in open defiance of the Inter-Parliamentary Union's Declaration on the Criteria for Free and Fair Elections.

At the general election, there were three alliance candidates, two Christians, and one atheist, two of us white, one of us black. We all subscribed to a common set of Core Policies. Alongside this, we all also pursued different single issues that *weren't* expressly set out in the list of Core Policies.

I am best known individually for my small part in the vital but under-publicised international movement against electromagnetic weapons. For example, I exhibited at the Labour conference last year, on this very topic, and I have been invited to give a speech at a civil rights rally in Washington DC on 8 October.

I am less well known for my human rights-based legal challenge this year against a catastrophic side effect of the "politically correct" Gender Recognition Act.

Our website is helping to publicise the concerns certain Scots comrades have raised, about the cover-up of a link between the perpetrator of the Dunblane massacre and earlier reports of child abuse at Queen Victoria School.

The alliance core policies are patriotic, humane, sensible, compassionate, reforming, and, above all, human rights-centred.

We are pro-Commonwealth, moderately Eurosceptic, immigrant-friendly, passionately opposed to detention without fair trial - and *torture*.

We are against identity cards and control orders.

We are against starting wars like the present war in Iraq. I personally am sufficiently opposed to want to do *enough* and *in time* to prevent the next such war, not, "too little, too late", as a Tory or a Blairite might manage to bring himself to do.

We *demand* debt relief when this will prevent hardship, and we *demand* fair trade.

We perceive an urgent need for fair votes, and for a more *genuine* democracy.

We are against official secrecy. What use is the vote, if you can't *recognise* the need to vote against policies that aren't even being *publicised*, let alone *debated*?

So-called "incitement to religious hatred" should not become a criminal offence. Free speech is too precious a right to sacrifice for the sake of political correctness.

I believe that all human beings have fundamental human rights, merely because they are human. I personally think that our youngest citizens should therefore no longer be at risk of being killed, inside their mother's wombs, between conception and birth.

The social agenda of the God I worship, as an openly Christian candidate, is not so very different from the socialistic agenda that some of the other candidates here today profess to have, although my own ideology has a different foundation.

For example, the apostle Paul wrote to the early Christians, "Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others."

And God's Holy Spirit moved Mary, the mother of the Lord Jesus Christ, to exclaim, "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant."

Mary went on to add, "He hath shewed strength with his arm; he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He hath put down the mighty from their seats, and exalted them of low degree. He hath filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he hath sent empty away."

Why are there so *many* candidates standing in this by-election? It is because we who are politically motivated but of "low degree", haven't yet formed the grand alliance that will be needed to "put down the mighty from their seats" at the next general election.

The true political opposition today are those who want to take down a peg or two the brotherhood of the rich, privileged and powerful. We have lost confidence in the sort of "lobby fodder" people whose boast is their "loyalty" to the so-called "main" political parties. These parties have sold out to that brotherhood. They pursue its inhumane agenda, to the harm of millions of ordinary people, at home and abroad.

Barring a miracle, we should not live in hope of *real* change without forming a powerful alliance that is a match at election time for a powerful and international class enemy. Those those who want change should therefore vote Alliance For Change.
