FROM THE RIDICULOUS TO THE SUBLIMINAL

Those who report attempts to influence their thoughts and behaviour remotely using little-publicised advanced technology have learnt to expect ridicule. However, the feasibility of such abuse has been proved, in Yorkshire, during the course of the present election campaign!

Today was a Wednesday, Market Day in Knaresborough. **Alliance For Change** candidate for Harrogate and Knaresborough, **John Allman**, visited Knaresborough's Market Square, armed with a device that incorporates outdated US military technology, technology that is obsolete nowadays for military applications, because better ways have been developed of achieving the same effects on people.

The technology is capable of making particular, targeted individuals hear voices in their heads which other people near to them cannot hear.

As two of the candidate's helpers handed out campaign literature, the candidate (to his shame) targeted those whom his helpers were successfully engaging in conversation, repeating to them a barely audible whispered message over, "**vote Alliance For Change on Thursday 5 May**".

Typically, targets could only hear the voices when invited to concentrate on listening very carefully, and couldn't make out the *entire* message, because it was so *quiet*. However, most *could* just about manage to make out the words "Alliance" and "Change".

None of those targeted managed to guess how the whispered message they could hear was being delivered to them.

The candidate has been corresponding with UK central government about the abuse of V2K and other human "manipulation" weapons for over two years now. V2K weapons are defined in the US Army's Military Thesaurus as follows:

"Voice to skull devices. ... Nonlethal weapons which includes (1) a neuro-electromagnetic device which uses microwave transmission of sound into the skull of persons or animals by way of pulse-modulated microwave radiation; and (2) a silent sound device which can transmit sound into the skull of persons or animals. NOTE: the sound modulation may be voice or audio subliminal messages. ... Acronym: V2K".

In 1999, the European Parliament passed a resolution, Resolution **A4-0005/99**. Paragraph **27** of this resolution "**calls for an international convention introducing a global ban on all developments and deployments of weapons which might enable any form of manipulation of human beings**".

The UK government is unwilling to give up manipulation weapons. According to the Home Office, the use of human thought reading and influence technologies by the law enforcement agencies and the intelligence services of the UK is overseen by the **Office of the Surveillance Commissioners** and the **Intelligence Services Commissioner**, and is perfectly *lawful*. The denial of information to complainants and the public, and the risk complainants face of ridicule (or worse), have prevented this questionable claim of lawfulness from being tested in court.

In the circumstances, it would be safer if we reserved our ridicule, for those who insist on assuming that the handful of Knaresborough voters abused today are the only victims of deniable operations that might influence members of the public subliminally.
